

Creative Borders

20-24 July 2020

The IASIL 2020 conference wishes to reflect on the concept of borders and their creative potential that helps define identities, generates critical discourses, and provokes literary works to tackle issues of global political, social, and cultural nature. On the one hand, the border is seen here as a necessary confinement and a formal limitation. On the other, it is viewed as an inspiring challenge to explore the other, the unknown, and the invisible, all of which lie beyond the widely accepted definitions and theories.

We wish to look at Irish literature as a product of imagination inspired and nurtured by English, European and global traditions connected with both Americas and the East (e.g. China and Japan). With this in mind, our definition of a border expands beyond purely geographic and political conditions of literary production; it accounts for differences in literary sensibility, aesthetic preferences, varieties of style and diction, and diverse selections of topics, which naturally result from a creative clash of literary traditions and artistic choices formed and bred under varying environments but coming into a creative confrontation in movements across real and imagined frontiers within global Irish studies.

In a long line of Irish writers who deliberately looked outside of Ireland for artistic inspiration and recognition, W. B. Yeats and James Joyce stand as perhaps the most conspicuous examples of artists whose imagination had been shaped by the experience of crossing and re-crossing the imaginary frontier. Yeats, for instance, did not see Irish identity as being at odds with the English language or foreign artistic traditions. Joyce, in turn, gave the issue of language a new inflexion when he had Stephen Dedalus muse “how different are the words home, Christ, ale, master” on the lips of an Englishman. The best Irish-language authors also strove to connect native traditions with outside influences in their work. This concept of productive translation between cultures and literary traditions phrased in varied inflections of language remains part of Irish peoples’ ability to reimagine themselves or travel between cultures. As Catriona O’ Reilly phrases it more poetically in “nowhere birds”, a titular poem from her debut collection, “There is no leaving for them / in such shifts south” and yet, “from their visiting wings’ / return were angels made.” The conference, therefore, seeks to explore ways in which Irish literary tradition is part of a broader constellation of influences in which borders mark an inspiring challenge for creative trespass, or for an onward journey and a divinely creative return. In a multicultural, postcolonial, or diasporic context Irish cultural heritage and artistic inventiveness positively engage with local traditions of Europe, both Americas and the East.

In the light of recent political debates about the definition of European integration and in the present context of Brexit, the frontier that has become once more a prominent subject of political and cultural debate is the border between Ireland’s North and South, which has created a special case for literary expressions of identity, national belonging, selfhood, and cultural politics of gender and class. These tensions have aptly been captured by Seamus Heaney in “Frontiers of Writing,” the last of his lectures as Oxford Professor of Poetry: “The Irish political leader operating between two systems of loyalty, the Irish writer responsive to two cultural milieux, the Irish place invoked under two different systems of naming [...]. The problem is familiar and one of its unignorable causes is the border in Ireland, a frontier which has entered the imagination definitively.” It is in view of this claim that the North and the South remain concepts that urgently demand exploration and revision in the light of the wide

range of social, cultural, and economic factors that help thematise and grasp existing divides. The conference, therefore, also seeks to explore themes concerning the Irish North and South reflected in literary, dramatic, theatrical, filmic, and artistic works.

We invite conference papers in the field of Irish literary studies which examine creative confrontations between such seemingly disparate concepts as tradition and modernization, parochialism and cosmopolitanism, nostalgia and futurity. We welcome topics which focus on social and cultural divisions, such as those that pertain to politics, religion, gender, class, (dis)ability, race, and ethnicity. We are also interested in contributions exploring Ireland and its global presence in the fields of literature, criticism, and research. Possible topics may include but are in no way limited to:

1. Literary visions and revisions of the idea of border(s) and liminality.
2. Representations of (in)authentic Irishness.
3. Mutual (re)conceptualisations of the Republic and Northern Ireland.
4. Border poetics and aesthetics.
5. Contested historical events and traditions as represented from various points of view.
6. Irish history (of the North and the South) and remembrance.
7. Political strife and its literary manifestations and reverberations.
8. Irish North and South seen through the eyes of the diaspora.
9. Immigration/emigration in Irish writing.
10. Irish-language tradition in the North/South.
11. Voices from the margins and their role in shaping the notion of Irishness.
12. Realism and experimentation in Irish writing and their relation to artistic avant gardes.
13. Ireland and Europe, marginality and centrality of perspective.
14. Irish literature reflected in criticism of academia outside Europe.
15. Translating, editing and publishing Irish literature outside of Ireland.
16. Irish studies, and Irish research outside of Ireland as a contribution to exploring Irish literature and culture.
17. The official and the alternative – artistic, theatrical, literary and publishing projects in the independent sector.
18. The changing relations between the centre and the periphery in Irish literature, Irish culture and Irish Studies.

In keeping with IASIL's general practice, papers are also invited in other areas of Irish literary studies.

The organisers invite proposals of 250 words for twenty-minute papers, or for three-paper panels or discussion roundtables, to be delivered in the English or the Irish language. Please also include a brief biographical sketch of 50-100 words. Proposals must be submitted to iasil2020lodz@uni.lodz.pl. The deadline for submission is 20 January 2020. PhD Forum

Applications are invited for the annual IASIL PhD Forum, at which postgraduate students have the opportunity to present their work-in-progress and receive feedback from established scholars. The Forum will take place on Monday 20 July, 9:00-14:00, prior to the opening of the conference of the association at the University of Łódź. Applicants must be postgraduate students working on a topic within Irish literary studies and paid-up members of IASIL. Applications should take the form of a 3000-word document outlining the student's dissertation project and his/her current state of research, and should be accompanied by a brief CV (500 words) and confirmation of their IASIL membership from the IASIL Treasurer.

Eligible participants will be selected on a first-come, first-served basis. The Forum can accommodate 10 students, who will be divided into two groups based on the area of their work. At the Forum, students will be asked to make a 5-minute presentation introducing their work to the group (the use of presentation software is encouraged); this will be followed by a detailed response to the students' submission from two tutors, and a general discussion. Lunch will be provided for the participants.

Participation at the Forum does not preclude the possibility of presenting a paper at the conference.

Other graduate students are welcome to sit in at the Forum and join the discussion.

Teorainneacha Cruthaitheacha

20-24 Iúil 2020

Is mian leis an gcomhdháil IASIL 2020 léargas a thabhairt ar choincheap na dteorainneacha agus ar na féidearthachtaí cruthaitheacha a bhaineann leo. Cabhraíonn teorainneacha féiniúlachtaí a shainmhíniú, cothaíonn siad dioscúrsaí criticiúla agus spreagann saothair litríochta a dhíríonn ar mhórchéisteanna polaitiúla, sóisialta agus cultúrtha. Ar thaobh amháin, is féidir breathnú ar an teorainn mar ghaibhniú riachtanach agus mar bhac foirmiúil. Ar an taobh eile, is dúshlán agus spreagadh í chun cuairt a thabhairt ar fhearainn dhifriúla, anaithnide agus dofheicthe, fearainn atá lasmuigh de shainmhínithe agus de theoiricí a nglactar leo go forleathan.

Ba mhaith linn breathnú ar litríocht na hÉireann mar thoradh samhlaíochta a fhaigheann a lán inspioráide ó thraidisiúin Shasana, na hEorpa agus an domhain, ó Mheiriceá Thuaidh agus

Theas agus ón Oirthear (ón tSín agus ón tSeapáin, mar shampla). I bhfianaise na smaointe seo, ní féidir ionannú a dhéanamh idir an teorainn agus cúinsí geografacha agus polaitiúla na scríbhneoireachta níos mó. Tá baint ag an téarma le difríochtaí i dtuiscint don litríocht, le roghanna aeistéitiúla, le difríochtaí stíle agus friotail agus le roghanna éagsúla topaicí. D'eascair siad go léir as traidisiúin liteartha agus roghanna ealaíonta a d'fhorbair i dtimpeallachtaí éagsúla ach ar tharla teagmháil chruthaitheach eatarthu i ngluaiseachtaí trasteorann (cuma an fíortheorainneacha nó teorainneacha samhailteacha atá i gceist) laistigh de réimse domhanda Léann na hÉireann.

Tá líon suntasach údar Éireannach a bhreathnaigh d'aon ghnó lasmuigh d'Éirinn chun inspioráid agus aitheantas a fháil. Ina measc, is iad W.B. Yeats agus James Joyce na scríbhneoirí is cáiliúla, b'fhéidir, ar chothaigh trasnú agus aththrasnú teorainneacha samhailteacha a gcuid samhlaíochta. Níor chreid Yeats, mar shampla, go bhfuil coimhlint dhoréitithe idir an fhéiniúlacht Éireannach agus teanga an Bhéarla nó traidisiúin liteartha neamhdhúchasacha. Bhain Joyce casadh nua as ceist na teanga nuair a lig sé do Stephen Dedalus a mhachnamh a dhéanamh faoina dhifriúla atá na focail "home, Christ, ale, master" i mbéal an tSasanaigh. Rinne na scríbhneoirí Gaeilge is fearr a ndícheall chomh maith, chun traidisiún na teanga dúchais agus tionchair ón iasacht a nascadh le chéile. Tá an t-aistriú táirgiúil seo idir cultúir agus traidisiúin, aistriú a léirítear trí sholúbthacht na teanga, mar chuid de bhua mhuintir na hÉireann iad féin a athshamhlú nó taisteal idir cultúir éagsúla. Mar a chuireann Caitríona O'Reilly i bhfriotail níos fileata é in "nowhere birds", dán teidil a céad chnuasaigh, "There is no leaving for them / in such shifts south" ach fós, "from their visiting wings' / return were angels made." Ba mhaith leis na gcomhdháil, mar sin, súil a chaitheamh ar na bealaí éagsúla ina bhfuil traidisiún liteartha na hÉireann lonnaithe laistigh de líonra níos leithne tionchar. Sa líonra seo, is ionann teorainneacha agus dúshláin a thugann spreagadh dúinn iad a thrasnú go cruthaitheach, nó turas ar aghaidh a dhéanamh agus filleadh ar ais go caithréimeach. I gcomhthéacs an ilchultúrachais, an iarchoilíneachais agus an diaspora, tarlaíonn teagmháil thairbheach idir oidhreacht chultúrtha na hÉireann agus traidisiúin áitiúla na hEorpa, Mheiriceá Thuaidh agus Theas, agus an Oirthir.

I bhfianaise na ndíospóireachtaí polaitiúla is déanaí faoi lánpháirtíú na hEorpa agus faoin mBreatimeacht go háirithe, tháinig an teorainn idir Tuaisceart agus Deisceart na hÉireann arís chun cinn mar ábhar díospóireachta i réimse an chultúir agus na polaitíochta. Spreag an teorainn seo, mar choincheap, an iliomad saothar liteartha a dhíríonn ar an bhféiniúlacht náisiúnta agus pearsanta agus ar pholaitíocht chultúrtha na hinscne agus na haicme.

Chuir Seamus Heaney síos ar an teannas seo in "Frontiers of Writing" an léacht dheireanach a thug sé mar Ollamh le filíocht in Oxford: "The Irish political leader operating between two systems of loyalty, the Irish writer responsive to two cultural milieux, the Irish place invoked under two different systems of naming [...]. The problem is familiar and one of its unignorable causes is the border in Ireland, a frontier which has entered the imagination definitively." Is léir ón ráiteas seo gur fiú (ath)machnamh a dhéanamh ar choincheapa an Tuaiscirt agus an Deiscirt i bhfianaise tosca sóisialta, cultúrtha agus eacnamaíochta a chuireann ar ár gcumas na deighiltí atá i gceist a aithint agus a thuiscint. Dá bharr sin, is mian leis an gcomhdháil freisin iniúchadh a dhéanamh ar théamaí Thuaisceart agus Dheisceart na hÉireann mar a léirítear i saothair litríochta, amharclainne, scannáin agus ealaíne iad.

Fáiltimid roimh pháipéir chomhdhála i réimse Léann na hÉireann a dhíríonn ar choimhlintí cruthaitheacha idir coincheapa a mbreathnaítear orthu, de ghnáth, mar chontrárthachtaí doréitithe. Ina measc siúd, áirítear an traidisiún agus an nua-aoisiú, an paróisteachas agus an t-iltíreachas, an chumha agus an todhcháí. Fáiltimid roimh thopaicí a dhéanann scagadh ar dheighiltí sóisialta agus cultúrtha, mar shampla iadsan a bhaineann le polaitíocht, reiligiún, inscne, aicme, cumas, éagumas, cine agus eitneachas. Tá suim againn freisin i bpáipéir ina

bpléitear Éire agus a teagmháil leis an domhan mór i réimsí na litríochta, na critice agus taighde. I measc na raidhse leathan topaicí ar féidir díriú orthu, áirítear:

19. Dearcthaí agus athdhearcthaí liteartha ar choincheap na teorann/na dteorainneacha agus na tairseachúlachta.
20. Athláithrithe an Éireannachais (neamh)bharántúil.
21. (Ath)coincheapuithe cómhálartacha Phoblacht na hÉireann agus Thuaisceart na hÉireann.
22. Filíocht agus aeistéitic na teorann.
23. Imeachtaí staire conspóideacha agus dearcthaí éagsúla orthu.
24. Stair na hÉireann (sa Tuaisceart agus sa Deisceart) agus cuimhneamh.
25. Coimhlíntí polaitiúla agus a léirithe agus a macallaí sa litríocht.
26. Tuaisceart agus Deisceart na hÉireann trí shúile an diaspóra.
27. An inimirce agus an eisimirce i litríocht na hÉireann.
28. Traidisiún na Gaeilge sa Tuaisceart/sa Deisceart.
29. Guthanna ón imeall agus a dtionchar ar choincheap an Éireannachais.
30. An réalachas agus an turgnamh i litríocht na hÉireann agus naisc le gluaiseachtaí an *avant-garde* ealaíonta.
31. Éire agus an Eoraip, imeallachas agus lárnacht na peirspictíochta.
32. Litríocht na hÉireann trí shúile na critice acadúla lasmuigh d'Eoraip.
33. Aistriú, cur in eagar agus foilsiú litríocht na hÉireann lasmuigh d'Éirinn.
34. Léann na hÉireann agus taighde ar Éirinn lasmuigh den oileán mar shaibhriú litríocht agus chultúr na hÉireann.
35. Ealaín "oifigiúil" agus "ailtéarnach" – tograí ealaíne, amharclainne, litríochta agus foilsitheoireachta sa rannóg neamhspleách.
36. An caidreamh athraitheach idir an lár agus an t-imeall i litríocht na hÉireann, i gcultúr na hÉireann agus i Léann na hÉireann.

Ag teacht le gnáthnós IASIL, beidh fáilte roimh pháipéir i réimsí eile de léann litríocht na hÉireann.
